We will be learning about Special Places: about the Hindu faith and their special place of worship: Mandirs

Science

We will be looking at what the Dinosaurs ate, and how that relates to food chains and compare theirs with other animals.

We will be classifying and sorting based on our own criteria and questioning. Using their similarities and differences.
